Other highlights this week:

---In the ACADEMICS category, the Gilder-Lehrman Institute's free virtual **Advanced Placement U.S. History & A.P. Government** summer classes are open to all interested students – rising seniors planning to take either class can especially benefit. SUNY Stonybrook's in-person **Oceanography** course is available to students 16 and older. And some **fall term courses** from several of the free **CUNY College Now program** campuses for rising 10th and 11th and 12th graders are now posted online.

---In the COMMUNITY SERVICE category, students 16 and older (by summer) may volunteer at the **South Street Seaport** in lower Manhattan, and also are eligible to help in a variety of roles at **Montefiore Hospital** locations in the Bronx. All students are welcome to help with the ongoing May/June '**Alice on the Wall**' painting/restoration project on the decorative wall adjacent to the Stuyvesant Bridge on Chambers Street.

---In the BUSINESS/JOBS section, there will be a **camp counselor job fair** in Brooklyn on Sunday, May 7th. And for those who enjoy tennis, all students may now apply for **Ball Crew jobs** with the U.S. Open in September!

---In the LEADERSHIP/GOVERNMENT category, all students are eligible for both the virtual one-month **Next Generation Summer Civics Fellowship** and the one-week in-person **Democracy Camp** and **YVote ChangeMaker Institute**. All students may also apply to the **AAPI Summer LEAD Conference**, and Asian-American 10th and 11th grade students are eligible for the six-week summer **Young Adult Service Program**.

---In the STEM section, today is the early deadline for the free virtual **Harvard Global Health Conference** (final deadline is May 15th); it takes place on May 20-21. The **Columbia Medical Cancer Center's Summer Enrichment Program** is virtual & focuses on new developments in cancer research. The **Teens in Health** program offers free virtual sessions covering healthcare, Neurology, Genetics, medical article-writing, and more. And the next monthly Neurology-focused **BraiNY Bunch** online session is this Sunday, May 7th (12:00 – 1:00pm)

“Students will examine the World Ocean and the chemical, geological, and physical processes that control its major features and the life that inhabits it, as well as explore human interactions with the marine environment. This intensive course is specifically designed for motivated high school students.
