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For ease of use, these newsletters are organized by different categories, such as Academic Programs, Business Internships & Jobs, STEM Opportunities, Community Service, and so on.

Here are some highlights for this week:

---In the EVENTS section, there are **two free college information fairs on Saturday, March 18th**; the **Latino College Expo** (open to all) at BMCC across from Stuyvesant, and the **Bottom Line College Fair** in Brooklyn.

---In the ACADEMICS category, some of the free summer **CUNY College Now summer classes** in a variety of subjects at various CUNY campuses are open for registration (for rising juniors and older (& in some cases for rising sophomores). And

there are numerous other classes & programs offered by private colleges & non-profit organizations, often with significant financial aid available to eligible students

---In the PARKS section, both the **Queens Botanical Garden** and the **NY Botanical Garden** (located in the Bronx) have programs for high school students, and the excellent **Brooklyn Bridge Park TIDES** program has a 3/24 application deadline.

---In the STEM/MEDICAL category, the **NYU Tandon School of Engineering** in Brooklyn and **Cooper Union** in Manhattan offer popular summer programs. The **City College CREST HIRES** summer program (focused on under-represented & female students, but all may apply) offers a \$1,000 stipend to participants. Numerous other computer science & engineering options can be found in this section. For students with an interest in medicine, there are the **Perry Initiative (for female students)**, the **Sophie Davis Medical School** summer program, the upcoming **Biomedical Hackathon**, the **NYSHECK Environmental/Health** sessions, and more..

2. Pre-College Program

“The Pre-College program is a selective commuter program designed to provide rising high school seniors with experience, connections and knowledge from their participation in one undergraduate college course. The program provides transferable college credits in various disciplines, including Art History, Business Administration, Computer Science, Philosophy, Public Health, and more.
