For ease of use, these newsletters are organized by different categories, such as Academic Programs, Business Internships & Jobs, STEM Opportunities, Community Service, and so on.

There are now a number of applications available for programs that take place in the upcoming 2023-2024 school year, meeting after-school or on weekends. For example, in the ACADEMICS section, the free **CUNY STEM Institute** (at City College in Manhattan) runs from September to December and is open to all grades.

In the THEATER/ARTS category, current sophomores can apply to the **92 Street Y's Teen Producers** program in Manhattan beginning in September, which introduces them to careers and professionals in a variety of arts-related areas –the application deadline is **June 30th**! And the free **Girls Write Now's Collaboratory program** for next school year, which allows female-identifying students from all grades to learn from and work with successful authors, has a July 10th deadline.

For students still seeking summer opportunities, **Community Service** is one area in which a substantial number of options remain available. Check that section: for example, all female Stuy students are invited to **help tutor female middle school students** (at Stuyvesant), those 16 and older can volunteer at the **South Street Seaport & on Governor's Island**, and all can enjoy the summer outdoors by working with one of the many **NYC Park programs** available in the PARKS/NATURE section.

Some other highlights from this week's edition:

--In the EVENTS category, now that students may have more free time, they can check out some of the upcoming events that span a variety of different fields of interest. The **Youth Climate Career Expo** in Manhattan on June 22nd will introduce them to careers and fields that relate to combatting climate change. The **Museum of Arts & Design's ArtsLab** on June 30th is a free program for students to create hands-on projects with the help of professional artists & curators. There will be a series of virtual **Marine Biology** sessions scheduled from late June to November – all are welcome. And all students can take advantage of the **free gym passes** offered by Planet Fitness until August 31st!

--In the STEM/MEDICAL section, juniors & seniors can still apply to the **Health Scholars Program at the Maimonides Health Center's Emergency Room** in Brooklyn –the summer cohort begins on July 3rd; they also offer a fall term program. And the Columbia Medical Center's Herbert Irving Center's virtual **Scientific Enrichment Summer Program** focuses on innovative cancer research & treatments; it is open to all students and their application deadline is **June 26th**!

***Deadline Approaching:* Oceanography Course at SUNY Stony Brook**

“Students will examine the World Ocean and the chemical, geological, and physical processes that control its major features and the life that inhabits it, as well as explore human interactions with the marine environment. This intensive course is specifically designed for motivated high school students. The short-term course will run for 2 weeks and meet for 4 – 5.5 hours each weekday at the Stony Brook Southampton campus. Content will be delivered via lectures, in- class activities (including a live plankton lab!), and 2 boat trips during which students will explore nearby coastal habitats using oceanographic sampling equipment.”
