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For ease of use, these newsletters are organized by different categories, such as Academic Programs, Business Internships & Jobs, STEM Opportunities, Community Service, and so on.

Here are some highlights for this week:

For students who enjoy the visual & performing arts, the deadline for the free **Summer Arts Institute** (at Frank Sinatra HS in Astoria, Queens) has been extended to February 8<sup>th</sup>. Current 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> graders may apply. There is also an in-person ‘**Arts Careers Open House**’ afterschool event on February 1<sup>st</sup> in Manhattan. And the **Whitney Museum’s Youth Insights** spring program allows students to engage with artists & curators at their weekly sessions –the application deadline is January 31<sup>st</sup>!

In the STEM section, there are numerous opportunities to peruse. **STEM Matters** is a free one-week program during the spring break, and it offers a variety of different programs throughout the city. The **NYU GSTEM** program for juniors also covers various STEM fields – the application deadline is February 1<sup>st</sup>! **Cooper Union’s STEM Saturdays** focuses on Virtual Reality innovations and is open to current 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> graders. The **New York Historical Society’s Tech Scholars** programs offers female-identifying students both a weekly spring term series of sessions (application deadline: January 29<sup>th</sup>) and a one-week (4/10 – 4/14) spring break program (3/5 deadline). And the **Quantum Computing Introductory Course** is a free virtual four-day opportunity for all students to learn about this exciting new field of computer science (application deadline: January 29<sup>th</sup>!).

There are several new **writing contests**, ranging from STEM Writing to Poetry, Mystery writing and more- some have February 1<sup>st</sup> application deadlines.

And, in the LEADERSHIP section, the TGR Foundation offers a free virtual interactive **Scholarship Application Workshop** on January 31<sup>st</sup>.

## Stanford University Compression Forum Summer Internship for SHTeM

“This unpaid internship is intended to provide early exposure to research transcending traditional disciplinary boundaries. Students will be grouped to multifaceted projects that will benefit from their existing interests and strengths, while exposing them to new areas. Projects will be mentored by students, faculty and staff of the Stanford Compression Forum and its affiliated organizations. Themes will span and combine the science of information and communication, engineering, the arts, linguistics, psychology, biology, neuroscience, computer science, technology, philosophy, and design, among other areas.”

### **Program in Algorithmic and Combinatorial Thinking (PACT)**

“The program teaches students about the mathematics and algorithms fundamental to the computer science field. Many summer programs teach high school students programming and application development, but this five-week intensive course is one of very few with a theoretical and proof-based emphasis. The only requirements to participate are high school algebra, the willingness to work hard and be challenged, and, above all, the desire to learn.”
