“Are you interested in studying defining moments in our history while relating those moments to the important issues we face as a nation today? This summer **Next Generation Politics** is partnering with the National History Academy (NHA) to inspire students to understand the foundations of American democracy and the responsibilities of citizenship through experiential learning. Using the Case Method Project curriculum developed by Professor David Moss at Harvard Business School, participants will closely examine cases covering different aspects of American democracy. Each case includes a decision point followed by relevant background information that the original decision maker would have had at that time. During the final discussion, participants take on the role of decision-makers to decide what they themselves would have done in each case.”

Ham4Progress Award for Juniors

“The Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History is proud to partner with *Hamilton* on the Ham4Progress Award for Educational Advancement. The award supports college-bound high school students from communities that directly experience the consequences of injustice and discrimination.

This award will provide up to ten Black, Latino/a, Indigenous, and Asian or Pacific Islander students \$2,500 for educational purposes in 2021. The \$2,500 award must be used toward educational purposes, which may include:

- Test preparation courses – Tutoring - College visits - Technology, including laptops, tablets, or other electronic devices used for learning.”
