---In the LEADERSHIP/GOVERNMENT section, the **National Youth Preparedness Council** is accepting applications; there is an Information Session scheduled for **February 17<sup>th</sup>**. The **NYC Votes Youth Ambassadors** program trains teens to become future community/government leaders – the deadline to apply is **February 25<sup>th</sup>**. Most of the 59 neighborhood **NYC Community Boards** welcome student member representatives (16 and older).

Some application deadlines are approaching (including a **2/16** deadline for Queens boards) – interested students should check that item ASAP.

And there are various **Youth Leadership Councils (YLC's)** throughout the city – these groups meet once or twice a month and student participants get to work with government officials and community leaders on a wide variety of projects.

---In the STEM section, **MIT's BeaverWorks** free spring online Programming & Engineering Saturday classes are open to all interested 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders- the application deadline is **February 24<sup>th</sup>**. The **NYC STEM Matters Spring Break** free program offers in-person hands-on STEM-focused activities at a wide variety of venues throughout the city. **Columbia University's Undergraduate Research Journal** welcomes all students to attend their virtual Research Information event on **March 6<sup>th</sup>** – participants will learn about research techniques & opportunities. And the **Museum of Mathematics** in Manhattan offers a wide range of programs & volunteer opportunities to high schoolers- check the link at the end of the STEM section for a comprehensive list.

---There are several new writing contests & programs in the WRITING/PERFORMING ARTS section. These usually offer cash prizes, and include the **Gilder-Lehrman Essay Contest**, the **Apprentice Writer** program (with a **February 15<sup>th</sup>** deadline), and the **Gerald Ford Writing Challenge**.

### **University of Maryland Eastern Shore Geosciences Program**

“The Geosciences Bridge Program offers a 6-week paid internship for students planning to pursue careers in the geosciences.
