---In the LEADERSHIP/GOVERNMENT section, the **National Youth Preparedness Council** is accepting applications; there is an Information
Session scheduled for **February 17**th. The **NYC Votes Youth Ambassadors**program trains teens to become future community/government leaders – the deadline to apply is **February 25**th. Most of the 59 neighborhood **NYC Community Boards** welcome student member representatives (16 and older).

Some application deadlines are approaching (including a **2/16** deadline for Queens boards) – interested students should check that item ASAP.

And there are various **Youth Leadership Councils (YLC's)** throughout the city – these groups meet once or twice a month and student participants get to work with government officials and community leaders on a wide variety of projects.
