Also in that section, there's a new offering from Columbia University; its **Youth Voices Lead** program invites students to apply for their community activism spring hybrid program. And the **Bank of America's Student Leaders Paid Summer Internship** program is now accepting applications from to current juniors & seniors

In this week's STEM section, there are several medical-related options with fast-approaching deadlines. The **Healthcare Essentials Career Program** introduces 10th, 11th, and 12th graders to career paths and interview, resume, communications, and other business-related skills (November 27th deadline). The **American College of Cardiology's Young Scholars** program pairs current 11th & 12th graders with practicing physician researchers beginning next April – the application deadline is December 1st. And (in the BUSINESS category) the NYC Exploring organization welcomes all students to their free weekly or biweekly afterschool sessions with several local hospitals.

Also in the BUSINESS category, NYC Exploring has new afterschool offerings with **M&T Bank** and **Neuman's Kitchen**. The **Tisch School of the Arts' Future Music Moguls program** for 9th, 10th, and 11th graders introduces participants to the Music Business, with two upcoming weekends of workshops & programming (16 hours total – the application deadline is November 29th).
