In almost every section/category below, excellent programs have application deadlines approaching in the next week or two – students still seeking summer options should click on a few relevant links and apply!!

Some highlights for this week:

---In the ACADEMICS section, there are a number of **Fall Term** (along with several summer term!) free **College Now** college-level classes in a variety of fields still

available for juniors and, with some programs, for sophomores to take. There's also a new fall term Columbia University weekend-course series (fairly expensive!), and a group of summer pre-college options (with tuition fees) that have deadlines next week.

--In the BUSINESS/JOBS category, note that there are a number of paid options for students, for the summer and for the fall term as well, including the **NYS Public Interest Research Group**, the **92 Street Y**, the **Gilder-Lehman Institute**, and several commercial companies.

--In the LEADERSHIP/GOVERNMENT category, note that the Parents' and Alumni Associations' first session of their new **virtual college-readiness prep program** - exclusively for Stuy students - is scheduled for **June 12th!**

--In the THEATER/ARTS category, **Arts Connection** offers a paid (\$1,200) summer program for current 11th and 12th graders - the deadline is **June 18th!** The **92 Street Y's Teen Producers** internship is a paid once a week fall term career **exploration program for current sophomores interested in the arts and/or arts careers. And Girls Write Now's Writing Collaboratory** is now accepting applications for their 2023 -2024 program.
