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**The deadline to apply for NYC's Summer Youth Employment Program is next Friday, April 23:**

All high school students 14 and older can (and should) apply for the **NYC Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)**. This program provides paid summer jobs to students – all are eligible to apply. **In case no other opportunities work out, a possible SYEP job can provide a productive summer.** Please check the application information in the 'Business & Jobs' section below.

This week's edition includes several other excellent and interesting new events & opportunities – **many have upcoming April deadlines- so please explore them ASAP.**

For example:

--In the ACADEMICS section, free **summer college courses** are available to juniors &, in some cases, sophomores via the **CUNY College Now** program – for example, Hunter College offers a free **Summer Science Academy** for current 10<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> graders.

--In the BUSINESS section, there is **COAP**, a free accounting career-introduction one-week summer program that also offers career, resume, and interview skills support. And all girls are eligible for the **BossGirls Summer Entrepreneurship Camp!**

--There are several excellent new opportunities in the Government/Leadership section for all students, including a **two-week PEN program** focused on free expression for writers and media throughout the world, and some new short programs from **Seeds of Peace.**

**Careers Night** next Wednesday (4/21) evening, plus **InSpirit AI**, a new Artificial Intelligence summer program offered by Stanford & MIT students.

### **Deadline Approaching: NYC Summer Youth Employment Program**

This program provides paid summer jobs for students 14 and older, chosen either by lottery or by applying to any one of the various organizations recruiting student participants (check links to find lists of organizations). SYEP provides New York City youth with paid summer experiences for up to six weeks in July and August. This year there are two separate programs (with separate applications): one for 14-15 year olds and one those older 16 and older.

“As a 14-15 year old youth you will participate in a paid project-based learning experience that will provide enriching career exploration, emphasize work-readiness, help foster leadership and develop numerous skills. Activities will take place for 12.5 hours a week for six weeks in July and August and participants will receive up to a **\$700 stipend** based on their attendance and participation.”
