There are a number of excellent new opportunities in this issue, including (just to highlight a few):

BUSINESS: The Harvard BOLD Business Conference for female students is accepting applications for their low-cost November in-person weekend event. The **Investin Success Beyond School** series of virtual events (designed for parents)

focuses on potential careers for students in medicine, psychology, and other fields. The **Young Founders Fellowship** program offers a virtual workshop for entrepreneurial students (free to Stuy students), focused on developing a new business ideas. **Futures and Options** has helped many Stuy students learn business skills and apply for business internships – the first deadline is next week.
