2023-2024 School Year Programs: Please note that included below are some programs for the upcoming school year, so be sure to consider them and to apply before the relevant deadlines.

Some highlighted items in this last edition for this school year:

--In the EVENTS (and BUSINESS) section, there is a free one-day event on July 12th at the **BlackRock financial company** for female students 16 and older – participants will meet and learn from successful financial professionals. Their application deadline is **June 28th**. Also in the BUSINESS category, the **Museum of Finance** offers free virtual personal finance & investment classes in July.

--In the COMMUNITY SERVICE category, all students may volunteer with the **Sparks Within Reach** summer program, which helps younger, disadvantaged students, and teaches leadership & organizational skills to its volunteers – the application deadline is **June 26th**!

--In the LEADERSHIP/GOVERNMENT section, all students may apply for the **Chinatown Summer Leadership Institute**, which meets once a week to delve into issues facing the Asian-American community (**Deadline: June 25th**).

--In the STEM section, students 16 and older may apply (ASAP!) for a **paid medical hospital internship program** that runs 4-6 weeks, three days per week.

And the **Junior Academy** is a virtual collaboration of international students working with scientists on issues facing the world; participants work in teams to find solutions! (Application deadline: **June 30th**).

--In the MUSEUM/ART section, there are still excellent options available. And for 2023-2024, the **Whitney Museum's Youth Insights** program is an in-person, once-a-week opportunity to learn about and create original art with museum curators & artists.

“Our New York State funded program leverages Vaughn’s aeronautical heritage and world class robotics championship teams to expose students to STEM-related fields, aviation related fields, while providing tutoring, standardized test prep, and college prep. Summer courses include Basic & Advanced Flight, Sports Medicine, Electronics, and more. Students in 7th - 12th grade are eligible based on two options of eligibility: ethnicity or low income. ***Deadline Approaching:* Oceanography Course at SUNY Stony Brook**

“Students will examine the World Ocean and the chemical, geological, and physical processes that control its major features and the life that inhabits it, as well as explore human interactions with the marine environment. This intensive course is specifically designed for motivated high school students. The short-term course will run for 2 weeks and meet for 4 – 5.5 hours each weekday at the Stony Brook Southampton campus. Content will be delivered via lectures, in- class activities (including a live plankton lab!), and 2 boat trips during which students will explore nearby coastal habitats using oceanographic sampling equipment.”
