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There are numerous free virtual & in-person ‘one-off’ events for high school students that focus on specific topics or fields, such as STEM, Environmental Science, Art, Careers, college admissions, and more. In addition to the interesting workshop presentations & content, these provide excellent networking opportunities for students to follow up & connect with experts & professionals in their areas of interest.

Some upcoming events focus on **Marine & Environmental Science College/Career Information** (tomorrow, Saturday, March 12th!), an **Internship Prep Workshop** (3/16), **free teen gallery tours at MOMA** (3/16), **Engineering & Computer Science events for female students** (3/26 & 4/9), and **college admissions/financial aid sessions** (3/23 and 3/29).

And keep in mind that the citywide **Summer Youth Employment Project** (SYEP) application has been posted online (see BUSINESS section for details). This program is open to all high school students, and provides paid opportunities in a wide variety of settings. Students are selected by lottery, but they must apply & select specific ‘providers.’ Most students should consider applying even if they apply to other programs— just in case their other options don’t work out.

Here are some other highlights for this week:

---In the STEM section, the free **Goals for Girls Summer STEM Program** for current 9th-grade female students has extended their deadline to March 21st. The **Columbia University Engineering the Next Generation** (ENG) summer program welcomes applications from current juniors, with a March 21st application deadline. And female students may also apply to the free **Kode with Klossy** computer science program.

"At the Icahn Center for Excellence in Youth Education (CEYE), we help more than 200 students each year from grade seven through college prepare for careers in science and health care. As a unit of Mount Sinai Health System's Office for Diversity and Inclusion, CEYE operates a range of school-year and summer programs geared to youth belonging to groups that are low-income or underrepresented in medicine."

1 - Introduction to Bioinformatics Course is a course designed to teach high school students the basic concepts of cellular and molecular biology, genomic science, and computer programming.

2 - Medical and Scientific Exploration is an online course designed to guide students through different laboratories or clinical departments within the Mount Sinai Health System through the real world application of scientific concepts.

3 - The Internship Placement Programs are programs designed to expose rising seniors to various careers in the scientific and medical field. **The Hospital Placement Program** gives students exposure to health careers while enhancing their basic science knowledge and research skills. **The Veterinary Sciences Program** is designed to expose students to the veterinary sciences in a biomedical research environment. **The DR MMEN** is a program designed to promote career advancement in the medical field for underrepresented communities.
