In this week's ACADEMICS section, there are two new groups of spring & summer educational options. Check the list of private university 'pre-college' classes for high school students, including **Cornell, Johns Hopkins** (with a Saturday, **12/17** afternoon

information session), **Washington University**, and more. There is also a new list of free ‘**STEP**’ STEM spring term programs offered at various CUNY campuses around the city –these are focused on economically-disadvantaged students & those from under-represented groups. And the **New York Math Circle** offers low-cost, high-quality mathematics programs (virtual & in-person); courses fill up quickly!

There are upcoming end-of-year deadlines for a number of excellent free programs in the LEADERSHIP section; some include SAT Prep and other college-admissions support.

For students interested in medical research programs, the **HOPP** summer program from Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center is open to all grade levels. Current seniors (18 & older by May, with minimum GPA criteria) can apply for **NYU Langone Hospital’s Health Career Opportunity Program** (application deadline: December 21st!). And, for female-identifying students, the next **Perry Initiative** virtual outreach event (focused on innovations in orthopedic medicine) is scheduled for January 17th – early registration is advised.

And all students can apply to the free **CS4ALL Pathfinders Computer Science** program. This six-month program has an upcoming **December 23rd** application deadline!

2- Explore Engineering Innovation (EEI)

“During the course, students complete activities in civil, chemical, electrical/computer, mechanical engineering, and materials science. By applying knowledge of math and science to labs and hands-on projects, the concepts learned in high school classrooms are linked to real-world practice. Additionally, students’ confidence grows as they attend college-level lectures, solve problems, test theories, and ultimately learn to think like engineers.”

3- Sustainable Energy Engineering (SEE)

“How can we design and implement new sustainable energy technologies that are resilient and economical, and that may be incorporated into the existing power grid? To answer these questions, we need to take a deep look the ways we currently use energy so that we may find ways to reduce our use, and we must study the science and engineering concepts behind our current methods of energy production and distribution, as well as the impact of policy on our ability to make change. This course will introduce students to these topics, giving them the fundamental knowledge

necessary to understand the challenges and opportunities in sustainable energy engineering, and to decide whether this is a field they want to pursue.”
