Some new programs to consider are highlighted below:

ACADEMICS: The **National History Academy Online** welcomes all student applications for their four-week summer program. The free, in-person six-week **Geosciences program at the University of Maryland** for current seniors interested in geosciences (focus on those from under-represented groups, but all may apply) has a May 31<sup>st</sup> deadline. And many free **College Now** summer college-level classes at CUNY campuses around the city are still available; current 10<sup>th</sup> and/or 11<sup>th</sup> graders may apply (eligibility criteria vary for each college).

BUSINESS/JOBS: **Tomorrow's Business Leaders** is a non-profit group that works virtually this summer with students of all grades on resumes, interview prep, personal finance, and more. The **Jane Street Insight Program** is a one-week, in-person opportunity in late August for female, transgender, and gender-expansive students to learn about the world of business at a downtown Manhattan financial company.

COLLEGE PREP: The **Bottom Line College Access/Success** programs welcome current juniors & seniors to their free summer programs. The **College Directions Summer Bridge** opportunity in the Bronx pays current juniors \$200 to do their two-week college prep program.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: There are new items for students interested in tutoring, teaching English, food support, and more. And in Queens, students may apply for healthcare options with an **emergency ambulance service** in South Bayside/Jamaica

Estates and various aide/helper positions at the **Margaret Tietz Rehabilitation Center** in Jamaica.

PARKS/NATURE: The **FXB Climate Advocates** program welcomes all students to apply for their six-day virtual opportunity. And the **Rising Earth Teen Production Council** allows students to work on environmental issues while creating their own graphic novel on this subject.

STEM: The **Urban Barcode** program in upper Manhattan welcomes all students to apply for their 2024-2025 school year courses in Biology & Genetics – the application deadline is **May 27<sup>th</sup>**. The virtual **APEX Medical Careers Panel** is scheduled for May 30th and is open to all. And **Capital One Coders** is a three-day virtual coding/website development program for all interested students – no experience required.

THEATER/WRITING/VIDEO: The **92 Street Y Teen Producers** program for rising juniors is a paid weekly internship in the field of performance production; it runs throughout the 2024-2025 school year. The **Octavia Project** for all students who identify as female, trans, nonbinary, or non-conforming is a free five-week summer workshop in Brooklyn that combines science, art, tech, and writing. And the **Ghetto Film School** and the **Breakthrough Video Challenge Contest** are both accepting applications for their video/film opportunities.

“This science education initiative engages NYC high school students in studies of biodiversity using DNA technology. Students take two training courses covering basic concepts in biodiversity, conservation biology, and science research. These courses also provide hands-on laboratory experience with common science research techniques. Selected students then conduct independent, student-driven research projects using DNA barcoding under expert mentorship.”

### **University of Maryland Eastern Shore Geosciences Program**

“The Geosciences Bridge Program offers a 6-week paid internship for students planning to pursue careers in the geosciences. The program includes lectures, field trips, hands-on activities, two for-credit college courses, housing, meals, travel to and from the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES), and a stipend. The program introduces high school **seniors** to ocean sciences, atmospheric sciences, and geographic information systems (GIS)/Remote Sensing techniques. The activities provided and experience on campus strengthen students’ knowledge of mathematics, teach them life skills that will prepare them for college life, and enhance their academic performance through advisement, social support, and tutorial services.”

### **New: Oceanography Course at SUNY Stony Brook**

“Students will examine the World Ocean and the chemical, geological, and physical processes that control its major features and the life that inhabits it, as well as explore human interactions with the marine environment. This intensive course is specifically designed for motivated high school students. The short-term course will run for 2

weeks and meet for 4 – 5.5 hours each weekday at the Stony Brook Southampton campus. Content will be delivered via lectures, in- class activities (including a live plankton lab!), and 2 boat trips during which students will explore nearby coastal habitats using oceanographic sampling equipment.”

“Columbia University's Academic Year Weekend program offers academically exceptional high school students a preview of the college experience through online coursework and community activities over ten weekends this fall. Choose from over thirty courses that emphasize experiential and collaborative learning. Students join their classes for two hours on Saturday or Sunday, learning from scholars and practitioners who are experts in their fields.

Students also participate in co-curricular activities which help build skills for college life and beyond. Upon successful participation, students receive official Columbia University Certifications of Participation and written evaluations from their instructor.”

**Updated: STEP SUMMER Programs:** “STEP (Science and Technology Entry Program) Academy is a New York State Education Department-funded pre-college program for middle and high school students interested in pursuing careers in the STEM professions. The goal is to increase the number of historically underrepresented and economically disadvantaged students prepared to enter college. The program invites **eligible** students to participate in workshops and enrichment courses in math, science, SAT, and college preparatory workshops. All eligible students may apply, with different application deadlines for each campus.”
