Some new programs to consider are highlighted below:

ACADEMICS: The National History Academy Online welcomes all student applications for their four-week summer program. The free, in-person six-week Geosciences program at the University of Maryland for current seniors interested in geosciences (focus on those from under-represented groups, but all may apply) has a May 31st deadline. "The Geosciences Bridge Program offers a 6-week paid internship for students planning to pursue careers in the geosciences. The program includes lectures, field trips, hands-on activities, two for-credit college courses, housing, meals, travel to and from the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES), and a stipend. Whichever extra-curricular program, internship, or community service activity a student may participate in, they should be sure to ask their supervisor/coordinator to write a letter of appreciation before it concludes – it is sometimes very difficult to obtain this later on. And the more personal & detailed the letter, the better. A copy should then be submitted to your counselor.
