This coming vacation week is an excellent time for students to apply for any of the remaining summer programs in this newsletter – many deadlines are fast approaching!

Here are a few highlights for this week:

---In the ACADEMICS section, there are some excellent free summer programs still available. These include the various **CUNY College Now** courses (mostly

for current 10th & 11th graders) and the CCNY (9th, 10th, and 11th graders eligible) and Hunter College (10th & 11th graders) **STEM/Summer Science programs**. And the **Columbia S-Prep** and various **Summer Technology Entry Program (STEP)** options are open to low-income and/or under-represented group students.

---In the COMMUNITY SERVICE category, the **Volunteer Referral Center** offers a free virtual guide to a wide variety of service opportunities for teens – check that item to register to receive their guide.

---In the STEM section, **Stem Matters** is a free summer program with a wide variety of activities & internships for current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders – the application deadline is **Tuesday, April 19th**.
