Columbia University's Freedom and Citizenship Program

“This program offers a four-week summer courses in political science & philosophy, followed by a civic leadership project that meets for twice-monthly after-school sessions throughout the 2021-2022 school year. This free program is aimed at low-income and first generation in their family college applicants; participants also receive college admissions support. **This year we are excited to offer a \$1,000 stipend** to students to make the program accessible to those who might otherwise need to find work in July. Students will receive part of the stipend at the end of the summer seminar and the remainder at the end of the academic year. Students must participate in the full program to earn the stipend.”

***Deadline Approaching:* National History Academy**

“Are you interested in studying defining moments in our history while relating those moments to the important issues we face as a nation today? This summer **Next Generation Politics** is partnering with the National History Academy (NHA) to inspire students to understand the foundations of American democracy and the responsibilities of citizenship through experiential learning. Using the Case Method Project curriculum developed by Professor David Moss at Harvard Business School, participants will closely examine cases covering different aspects of American democracy. Each case includes a decision point followed by relevant background information that the original decision maker would have had at that

time. During the final discussion, participants take on the role of decision-makers to decide what they themselves would have done in each case.”
