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This edition includes some new events & opportunities in most of the sections below— **some have deadlines coming up next week- so please explore them ASAP.**

For example:

--In the ACADEMICS section, there are the free CUNY College Now remote summer & fall term course offerings for sophomores & juniors- including **Baruch College (June 4 deadline) & Queensborough Community College** summer classes. And for the **Fall Term**, you may now apply for course offerings from **ten** different CUNY colleges’ – which include many STEM and Humanities-focused subjects. All students can also explore many university summer pre-college courses via the link listed in the item titled “**Other College Courses Offerings.**” Students may also apply for the free ten-week fall term **Virtual National Security Language Initiative** to learn a new language!

--In the BUSINESS/JOBS section, there are new summer internships offered by the Chinese Consolidated Benevolent Association and a new start-up organization focused on helping small Queens restaurants. And all students can check out the “**Summer Camp Jobs**” item, which has a link for several camps seeking summer employees.

--In the THEATER/WRITING section, there is a new free writing/journalism summer program offered by City Limits (**May 30 deadline**).
