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Please note that a large number of excellent opportunities have March 31st and April 1st deadlines – **NOW** is the time to focus and get your applications in!!

Here are some highlights for this week:

---In the EVENTS section, a group of top colleges are offering upcoming **Splash!** one-day or weekend free/very low cost mini-classes taught by their undergraduate & graduate students, who also answer questions about their schools. **Columbia University's** event is Sunday, **April 3rd** (with a 3/28 registration deadline); **Northeastern University's** is scheduled for **Saturday, March 26th**, and Princeton, Berkeley, Cornell, and others are also available this spring.

---In the ACADEMICS section, the free **City College STEM Institute** welcomes 9th, 10th, and 11th grade applicants for its excellent six-week summer program. The **Columbia Science Honors** program for the 2022-2023 school year has extended its application deadline to April 15th. And several of the free **CUNY College Now** campuses have March 31st deadlines for their summer courses!

---In the COMMUNITY SERVICE category, the **Brooklyn Public Library** virtual '**Tomorrow's Techies T4**' program is now open for applications. And students may also check the provided link to apply for volunteer spots with NYC Public Library branches throughout the city. For those 16 and older who are interested in tutoring younger students, the **Go-Getters** non-profit organization offers options with a variety of elementary school students.

---In the GOVERNMENT/LEADERSHIP category, the **Apex Mentor** program matches students with professional mentors for monthly meetings during the 2022-2023 school year. Icahn School of Medicine High School Summer Program

"At the Icahn Center for Excellence in Youth Education (CEYE), we help more than 200 students each year from grade seven through college prepare for careers in science and health care. As a unit of Mount Sinai Health System's Office for Diversity and Inclusion, CEYE operates a range of school-year and summer programs geared to youth belonging to groups that are low-income or underrepresented in medicine."

1 - Introduction to Bioinformatics Course is a course designed to teach high school students the basic concepts of cellular and molecular biology, genomic science, and computer programming.

2 - Medical and Scientific Exploration is an online course designed to guide students through different laboratories or clinical departments within the Mount Sinai Health System through the real-world application of scientific concepts.

3 - The Internship Placement Programs are programs designed to expose rising seniors to various careers in the scientific and medical field. **The Hospital Placement Program** gives students exposure to health careers while enhancing their basic science knowledge and research skills. **The Veterinary Sciences Program** is designed to expose students to the veterinary sciences in a biomedical research environment. **The DR MMEN** is a program designed to promote career advancement in the medical field for underrepresented communities.

Updated: Johns Hopkins Engineering Innovation Pre-College Program

“Explore Engineering Innovation is an exciting, college-level, summer program for motivated high school students with an aptitude in math and science and curiosity about engineering. During the course, students explore a variety of topics and disciplines in engineering and have the opportunity to earn Johns Hopkins University (JHU) credit. During the course, students complete activities in civil, chemical, electrical/computer, mechanical engineering, and materials science. By applying knowledge of math and science to labs and hands-on projects, the concepts learned in high school classrooms are linked to real-world practice. Additionally, students’ confidence grows as they attend college-level lectures, solve problems, test theories, and ultimately learn to think like engineers.”
