Students still seeking summer opportunities should select and apply ASAP to any of the many opportunities in the various categories listed below (some free or low-cost) – community service options, for example, can be part-time or full-time, tutoring/helping younger students, working in parks, volunteering with local government officials, and more. At this point students can't be too picky, and should consider any options that they might find interesting or enjoyable. And a good number of programs for the fall term are now posting applications, such as free **CUNY College Now** classes from Hunter & City Colleges (more to follow in the coming weeks), the Student Historian Internship Program, the virtual **NY Academy of Science's Junior Academy STEM Mentorship** program, the volunteer **Brooklyn Techies** option from the Brooklyn Public Library, and more. Some deadlines are due in the next few weeks, so check them out!

Some interesting programs to consider are highlighted below:

ACADEMICS: In addition to some still-available summer free CUNY College Now courses, more campuses are posting their fall term schedules online- **City College and Hunter College** options are included in this section. The New York Historical Society's **Student Historian Internship Program** (SHIP) welcomes current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders to apply for their September – June in-person program.

COLLEGE PREP: The **Apex for Youth College Access Program** provides significant college admissions, internship, and other support to rising Asian-American or immigrant juniors with lower family incomes. And the virtual **MATRICULATE** program is for rising seniors – it provides one on one mentors and other support.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: The **Sparks Within Reach** program welcomes all Stuy volunteers to assist housing-insecure youth with tutoring & general support. **NYC Youth Food Advocates** invites current students to develop projects to help fight hunger, with a focus on school food programs; it involves a one-week summer training and occasional school-year activities..

GOVERNMENT/LEADERSHIP: **Pen America** offers a one-week summer workshop on protecting free expression around the world, followed by 2024-2025 action projects.

STEM: The **American College of Cardiology's Young Scholars Program** now welcomes students from all grades to apply - it includes a full year of mostly virtual presentations & activities on new medical developments. The **New York Academy of Science's Junior Academy** is a virtual program connecting high school students from around the world to work with scientific mentors on various projects aimed at making a better world. And Drexel University in Philadelphia offers a low-cost, in-person **Digital Development Camp** for current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders with an interest in Computer Science.

WRITING: The **CLARIFY Journalism** program provides hands-on experience in reporting about local issues & events – it runs from October – December.

New: Student Historian Internship 2024-2025 Program

“Student Historian interns are high school students who use the resources of the New York Historical Society to conduct exciting research and share their scholarship through creative digital projects. Interns meet with professional staff to learn about careers in the museum, library, and history fields; work collaboratively with fellow students to develop their public speaking and leadership skills; and engage in hands-on work to deepen their understanding of American history. The theme of this year’s internship is “Our Composite Nation: Frederick Douglass’ America”

Upon completion, participants receive a \$700 stipend.

“The Fordham Science and Technology Entry Program (STEP) is an academic enrichment program, established in 1986, designed to prepare underrepresented minority and economically disadvantaged junior high and high school students for college and careers in STEM fields (science, technology, engineering, and math) fields, health careers, and licensed professions, like accounting, law, psychology, social work among other licensed fields.”

“Students will examine the World Ocean and the chemical, geological, and physical processes that control its major features and the life that inhabits it, as well as explore human interactions with the marine environment.
