The citywide **Summer Youth Employment Project** (SYEP) application has been posted online (see BUSINESS section for details). This program is open to all high school students, and provides paid opportunities in a wide variety of settings. Students are selected by lottery, but they must apply & select specific ‘providers.’ Most students should consider applying even if they apply to other programs— just in case their other options don’t work out.

Here are some other highlights for this week:

---In the BUSINESS/JOB category, students may register for the in-person **Summer Job Expo at Snug Harbor** in Staten Island on March 12<sup>th</sup>. They will

learn about the spots available (via the SYEP program) at this major cultural/environmental center.

---In the COMMUNITY SERVICE category, **Sunnyside Community Services** in Queens offers an array of ways for students to help, including with children, seniors, administrative tasks, and their PetPals program to assist homebound New Yorkers with walking& taking care of their pets!

---In the LEADERSHIP/GOVERNMENT section, the **Questbridge College Prep** program for low-income juniors provides college admissions support, free summer college classes at local campuses, and automatic access to their senior-year College Match full scholarship program. And the **Opportunity Network** offers low-income sophomores or those 10<sup>th</sup>-graders from under-represented groups a six-year program of academic, college, and career support!

---In the STEM section, the **CREST/Hires Summer STEM Program** provides low-income, female, or under-represented groups a seven-week series of classes, presentations, and activities focused on Earth Science & Engineering, and it includes a \$1,000 stipend!

The free **CUNY Sophie Davis Medical School's Healthcare Professions Mentorship Summer Program** welcomes applications from current sophomore students. And there are several excellent math programs with upcoming deadlines, including **PACT, MathCamp, SUMac**, and the **NYC Math Circle** – check them out before their applications close in the next week or so.

For ease of use, these newsletters are organized by different categories, such as Academic Programs, Business & Jobs, Community Service, and so on.

“This unpaid internship is intended to provide early exposure to research transcending traditional disciplinary boundaries. Students will be grouped to

### **Icahn School of Medicine High School Summer Program**

"At the Icahn Center for Excellence in Youth Education (CEYE), we help more than 200 students each year from grade seven through college prepare for careers in science and health care. As a unit of Mount Sinai Health System's Office for Diversity and Inclusion, CEYE operates a range of school-year and summer programs geared to youth belonging to groups that are low-income or underrepresented in medicine."

**1 - Introduction to Bioinformatics Course** is a course designed to teach high school students the basic concepts of cellular and molecular biology, genomic science, and computer programming.

**2 - Medical and Scientific Exploration** is an online course designed to guide students through different laboratories or clinical departments within the Mount Sinai Health System through the real world application of scientific concepts.

**3 - The Internship Placement Programs** are programs designed to expose rising seniors to various careers in the scientific and medical field. **The Hospital Placement Program** gives students exposure to health careers while enhancing their basic science knowledge and research skills. **The Veterinary Sciences Program** is designed to expose students to the veterinary sciences in a biomedical research environment. **The DR MMEN** is a program designed to promote career advancement in the medical field for underrepresented

communities.
