Please note that a good number of NEW programs are listed in today's edition, please check them out ASAP, as deadlines are rapidly approaching – several are highlighted below:

EVENTS: Two STEM-focused fairs are coming up: The **Bit By Bit Tech Conference** for female & non-binary students is tomorrow, (4/6) at Dalton High School in Manhattan. And the **Tri-State Engineering Expo** (4/14) in White Plains, NY, is open to all students with an interest in Engineering & Tech fields.

ACADEMICS: CUNY College Now free summer courses are available at campuses throughout the city – the **Baruch College** registration deadline is today!

BUSINESS/JOBS: There is a new list of paid summer camp positions open to high school students. The **Museum of Finance Academy** offers an excellent virtual program of free finance/business-related classes to juniors & seniors – the application deadline is **April 9th**. And the **New York Public Library's Business Plan Competition** is open to residents of Manhattan, Staten Island, and the Bronx. It offers significant cash prizes – the first online orientation session is April 9th!

LEADERSHIP: Numerous excellent programs have deadlines coming up in the next ten days. These include the **Student Historian** internship at the New York Historical Society (4/7), the **Young Leaders Summit** program for lower-income juniors (4/8), the **Sadie Nash Leadership Institute** for female & gender-expansive youth (4/15), among others.

MUSEUMS/ART: There is an **Earth Day Poster Contest** (Planet Versus. Plastics) open to all- the deadline is April 8th. The **Paley Center for Media** in Manhattan offers two summer programs (with one being a paid position) for current 10th and 11th graders; the deadline for both is **April 12th**. The **Guggenheim Museum's Art Detectives** summer program for current sophomores & juniors offers arts conservation & museum management training.

For students interested in architecture and urban design, the **New York City College of Technology (City Tech)** in Brooklyn offers a one-month free program for current 10th and 11th graders. And **Barnard College** in Manhattan welcomes female 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students to apply for their free three-week summer architecture program.

STEM: The **NYU/Tandon School of Engineering** in Brooklyn offers a number of summer Tech-focused programs for high school students, with some free and some with fees – the next application deadline is **April 14**.

John Jay College in Manhattan offers a free two-day **Forensic Science Lab Workshop** during spring break – the application deadline is **April 15th**. **Stem Matters** is a free NYC summer STEM program for all grades, covering one-week or multi-week sessions – apply by April 24th. And the Manhattan College (in the Bronx) free **Summer Engineering Program** is open to 10th and 11th graders, with a focus on under-represented and female students (but all may apply).

SCHOLARSHIPS: The **Stuyvesant Alumni Association Scholarship Program** is accepting applications until April 26th – these are open only to Stuy students, so be sure to apply!

Some answers to common questions on the FAFSA/providing financial information:

- If the students have already provided their colleges with the CSS Profile, they can submit that form in lieu of the FAFSA, but only if they did not submit a FAFSA.
- If the student never filed either the CSS or FAFSA because they are not a citizen or legal permanent resident, they should be sure to state it's because they are not a citizen or legal permanent resident in the "Financial aid information" question on the application. All information submitted by the students in their application is kept to the strictest confidentiality. All of the staff and any scholarship committee members, as well as any other additional parties who read the scholarship applications, must sign and adhere to a confidentiality agreement.
- Students must provide the financial information listed in the checklist in some form, even if they submit a one-page doc with all of it listed out.
