There are a number of excellent new opportunities in this issue, including (just to highlight a few):

Many organizations offer free assistance with the college admissions process. In the EVENTS and the LEADERSHIP/COLLEGE PREP sections, seniors in particular can check out the virtual essay-support programs from the Queens Public Library (plus their one-on-one virtual college sessions with research

librarians), the TGR Foundation, and the Bottom Line program.
