There are a number of excellent new opportunities in this issue, including (just to highlight a few):

Many organizations offer free assistance with the college admissions process. In the EVENTS and the LEADERSHIP/COLLEGE PREP sections, seniors in particular can check out the virtual essay-support programs from the Queens Public Library (plus their one-on-one virtual college sessions with research

librarians), the TGR Foundation, and the Bottom Line program.

In the MUSEUMS/ART category, there are excellent options with the Museum of Modern Art, the Noguchi Museum, the Museum of Arts & Design, the Studio Museum, and the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Some of these havin deadlines coming uo next week!
