Now that we are into the month of May, students should check these still-available opportunities and submit applications – many programs have rapidly approaching deadlines – several are highlighted below:

EVENTS: All students are welcome to register for free after-school **dance classes at Stuy**, offered by outstanding instructors from the Battery Dance Group. Updated: STEP SUMMER Programs: “STEP (Science and Technology Entry Program) Academy is a New York State Education Department-funded pre-college program for middle and high school students interested in pursuing careers in the STEM professions. The goal is to increase the number of historically underrepresented and economically disadvantaged students prepared to enter college, and improve their participation rate in mathematics, science, technology, health-related fields, and the licensed professions

The program invites **eligible** students to participate in workshops and enrichment courses in math, science, SAT, and college preparatory workshops. All eligible students may apply, with different application deadlines for each campus.”

Priority Deadline Today: Fordham University STEP Summer Program

“The Fordham Science and Technology Entry Program (STEP) is an academic enrichment program, established in 1986, designed to prepare underrepresented minority and economically disadvantaged junior high and high school students for

college and careers in STEM fields (science, technology, engineering, and math) fields, health careers, and licensed professions, like accounting, law, psychology, social work among other licensed fields.”

Eligible: Rising sophomores, juniors, and seniors with at least an 85 average in math and science courses of underrepresented groups (Black/African Americans, Hispanics/Latinxs, Native American Indians, and Alaskan Natives) **OR** economically disadvantaged students

2. Explore Engineering Innovation (EEI)

“During the course, students complete activities in civil, chemical, electrical/computer, mechanical engineering, and materials science. By applying knowledge of math and science to labs and hands-on projects, the concepts learned in high school classrooms are linked to real-world practice. Additionally, students’ confidence grows as they attend college-level lectures, solve problems, test theories, and ultimately learn to think like engineers.”

3. Sustainable Energy Engineering (SEE)

“How can we design and implement new sustainable energy technologies that are resilient and economical, and that may be incorporated into the existing power grid? To answer these questions, we need to take a deep look the ways we currently use energy so that we may find ways to reduce our use, and we must study the

science and engineering concepts behind our current methods of energy production and distribution, as well as the impact of policy on our ability to make change. This course will introduce students to these topics, giving them the fundamental knowledge necessary to understand the challenges and opportunities in sustainable energy engineering, and to decide whether this is a field they want to pursue.”
