In this week's <u>STEM</u> section, there are numerous excellent new options.

Rockefeller University's Data for the People virtual initiative welcomes all students to jo join their weekly sessions about the use of new data science techniques to understand human disease. The application deadline is **January 18th**!

The **Cornell Catalyst Academy** is a one-week summer introduction to Engineering/STEM subjects for current 10th and 11th graders, with a focus on under-represented/low-income/female students, though all may apply.

The **International Summer School for Young Physicists** for juniors & seniors is a low-cost chance to learn virtually about advanced topics in physics and math.

The **International Young Researchers' Conference at Columbia Medical School** is a virtual introduction to summer research in medicine and neurology and is open to all students.

And the free **NYU Arise Summer STEM Program** (for current 10th and 11th graders), along with the **Columbia SHAPE Engineering Program** (which is open to all grades and may offer financial aid to eligible students), have been popular among Stuy students.
