Rockefeller University Summer Science Research Program (SSRP) Virtual Information Session

This is an outstanding, free seven-week summer science research program for students 16 and older (at start of program). SSRP scholars will have the opportunity to design and conduct their own research project as part of a themed research track. Each research track is modeled after a Rockefeller research topic and/or technique, and includes a team of scientist mentors from the Rockefeller community. The majority of research will take place in the RockEDU Laboratory — a 3,000 square foot authentic research space exclusively dedicated to support biomedical research skills development. Monitors can also make a great donation! We accept any type (CRT, flat-screen, etc). Our one requirement when it comes to computer donations is that the computer has a **dual-core or higher-core-count CPU**. If potential donors aren't sure about their computer's CPU core count, they can e-mail us at our e-mail (see below) to verify. Most computers manufactured from 2006 onward meet this requirement.

Donors help prevent electronic waste and also help someone in need. And all donations are tax-deductible!
