In this week's STEM section, there are several excellent new options. The **Healthcare Essentials Career Program** introduces 10th, 11th, and 12th graders to career paths and interview, resume, communications, and other business-related skills. **Cooper Union's STEM Saturdays** welcomes all 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students (priority to underrepresented groups) to join their program incorporating, engineering, design, and entrepreneurial training to solve community problems – financial aid may be

available. All students may apply for the free **Endless Labs Youth Ambassador Program**, which combines technology, science, and entrepreneurship. And NYU's **G-STEM Program** is for juniors & seniors with an interest in data science; some financial aid may be available for eligible students.
