In this week's STEM section, there are several excellent new options. The **Healthcare Essentials Career Program** introduces 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, and 12<sup>th</sup> graders to career paths and interview, resume, communications, and other business-related skills. **Cooper**
