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For ease of use, these newsletters are organized by different categories, such as Academic Programs, Business Internships & Jobs, STEM Opportunities, Community Service, and so on.

Here are some highlights for this week:

---In the EVENTS section, **Columbia University SPLASH** on Sunday, April 2nd is a chance for all high school students to take free mini-classes in a variety of STEM & Humanities disciplines on the Columbia campus. Classes fill up quickly (the application deadline is **March 18th**), so register ASAP!

---In the BUSINESS/JOBS category, there are several interesting programs with fast-approaching deadlines:

1-Columbia Business School offers a free (students receive a stipend) summer **First Generation Entrepreneurship Business Program** for current 10th and 11th grade students who live in certain uptown Manhattan & Bronx neighborhoods. There is an **Information Session** scheduled for **Saturday, March 11th** and the application deadline is **March 17th**.

2-Indiana University offers a free in-person, one-day (4/14) **Young Women's Institute** Business Program to female 10th and 11th graders with a minimum 3.5 GPA (transportation costs not covered). The application deadline is **March 15th**.

3-There are paid summer jobs (for seniors who live in Brooklyn) available with companies at the Brooklyn Navy Yard complex. The application deadline is **March 17th**.

4-And all students should consider applying to the **NYC Summer Youth Employment Program** (SYEP); the application has been posted online (see BUSINESS section for details). This program is open to all high school students, and provides paid opportunities in a wide variety of settings (along with the similar NYC-funded **Ladders for Leaders** job program for juniors & seniors over 16). Most students should consider applying even if they apply to other programs– just in case their other options don't work out.

---In the STEM/MEDICAL category, Columbia offers a free, four-session virtual **Introduction to Synthetic Biology** course – it meets on Sunday afternoons from 3/19 – 4/9. The application deadline (for Stuy students) is **March 13th**!

And the NYU Grossman School of Medicine offers their **Rise Up** summer medical program to students from groups under-represented in the fields of medicine & science. The application deadline for this four-week program is **March 15th**.

IN the RESOURCES section, there is a very helpful database of internships & other opportunities for high school students. This **StandOut High School Internship Database** is definitely worth checking out!

“The Geosciences Bridge Program offers a 6-week paid internship for students planning to pursue careers in the geosciences. The program includes lectures, field trips, hands-on activities, two for-credit college courses, housing, meals, travel to and from the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES), and a stipend.
