**Spring break** is a great time to check these opportunities and submit applications – many programs have rapidly approaching deadlines – several are highlighted below:

EVENTS: The **Manhattan District Attorney's** office will do a presentation for students with an interest in law at Apex for Youth in downtown Manhattan on April 23<sup>rd</sup>. Two **science-focused career fairs** for students will be offered by York College in Queens (May 4<sup>th</sup>) and the New York Hall of Science (May 17<sup>th</sup>). And **free once-a-week dance lessons** in Hip Hop, Contemporary, and other dance styles are available to Stuy students in May by professional instructors from Battery dance – no experience required!

BUSINESS/JOBS: Free **virtual courses in Finance** from the Museum of Finance are open to juniors & seniors – they begin on April 23<sup>rd</sup>.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: New **hospital volunteer options** in several boroughs are listed this week.

MUSEUMS/ART: The **Noguchi Museum 'Make Your Mark'** summer program in Queens, for current 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> graders is now open for applications; it includes a \$600 stipend.

PARKS/NATURE: **NYC Zoos and the Aquarium** in Coney Island are accepting applications for their summer 'Discovery Guide' program until May 1<sup>st</sup>.

STEM: The free **STEM Matters** program welcomes all students to apply for their wide variety of STEM-focused programs at institutions around the city – the application deadline is April 24<sup>th</sup>.

**Updated: STEP SUMMER Programs:** “STEP (Science and Technology Entry Program) Academy is a New York State Education Department-funded pre-college program for middle and high school students interested in pursuing careers in the STEM professions. The goal is to increase the number of historically underrepresented and economically disadvantaged students prepared to enter college, and improve their participation rate in mathematics, science, technology, health-related fields, and the licensed professions

The program invites **eligible** students to participate in workshops and enrichment courses in math, science, SAT, and college preparatory workshops. All eligible students may apply, with different application deadlines for each campus.”
