As we move into November, our students hopefully have settled into regular schedules and developed productive routines. This is a good time, particularly for our ninth-graders (who have been adjusting to life at Stuy), to consider getting involved in an extra-curricular activity or program that matches their interests & aptitudes. Even one-time events or short-term programs can be educationally and personally stimulating and introduce students to new ideas, skills, and college/career pathways.

One example (in the EVENTS or STEM section) is a virtual career panel about the growing field of **Data Science**, offered by the TGR Foundation on **November 2nd**. And the November **Health Professions Week** online events culminate with a broad ranging **Career Fair** event on the evening of **November 10th**.

In the BUSINESS category, the **NYC Exploring** organization uses in-person & virtual weekly or bi-weekly after-school sessions to introduce students to a wide variety of careers, including Engineering, Law, Business, and more.

In the MUSEUMS/ART section, students who enjoy creating and learning about art and museum management can check out the free **Teen Open Studio** after-school session at the **Whitney Museum**, or the **Museum of Jewish Heritage's** (near Stuyvesant) Spring/Summer Apprenticeship. The **Center for Architecture** in Manhattan offers low-cost one-day programs (the next is on **November 5th**). And all students may apply for the **Museum of Arts and Design's** free one-week February & Spring-break in-person **Intensive Recess Internships**.

And, in the **PARKS** category, the **Brooklyn Botanic Garden's Garden Apprentice Program** (for 9th, 10th, and 11th graders) is an excellent horticulture/plant science/outdoors opportunity, and can lead to paid internships in the future.

New: Ship-to-Shore Tour: Climate Science in Action

“See how climate science discoveries are made! The JOIDES Resolution (JR) is a research vessel that drills into the ocean floor to collect and study sediment samples that provide scientists with a trove of information about Earth’s climate history. In this event, researchers currently aboard the JR will livestream from “ship to shore”—from their current location off the coast of Portugal to the Climate Museum Pop-Up. They will give a tour of the vessel and explain how they use data from these ocean floor samples to better understand climate change, geology, and Earth’s history. We will also be joined in-person by Dr. Gisela Winckler of Columbia University’s Lamont-Doherty Earth Observatory, who was the Co-Chief Scientist of a major international JR expedition in 2019. Dr. Winckler will moderate the livestream and field additional climate science questions from the audience. This event is intended for all ages and will include kid-friendly interactive activities.”

New: Postcard Poetry: A High School Writing Workshop for Climate Action

“Calling all high school poet-activists! Join us for a session of poetry writing and climate action as we counter political apathy with poetry!

We will gather at The Climate Museum’s Soho pop-up location to write postcard-sized poems to send to our elected officials, responding both to David Opdyke’s moving work of climate art, *Someday, All This*, and to the urgency of the crisis our planet is facing. We will first hear from climate scientist Dr. Sonali McDerimid, and then from the artist David Opdyke himself about the inspiring work, which is composed of four hundred hand-modified postcards dramatizing the struggle for action on climate.

Following a discussion with the artist, The Climate Museum’s resident poet John Linstrom will lead us through a poetry-writing exercise inspired by Opdyke’s work, in which we will address postcards to our elected representatives that we will fill with poetry communicating, in human terms, the urgency of action on climate change.

After the conclusion of the program, these postcards will be mailed, and we hope to inundate our elected leaders with poetry!

Participants will produce as many postcard poems as time allows, learn about the climate crisis and how the visual and literary arts can meaningfully engage the crisis, meet artist David Opdyke, and take part in this direct action campaign.”

New: Hispanic Heritage Foundation Youth Awards Scholarship

Gold, Silver, and Bronze recipients are selected in each category and receive a one-time grant to fund their college education or community service effort that tackles a social issue.

The Youth Awards program is the main pipeline to the Hispanic Heritage Foundation's system of talent that prepares and positions Latinx youth through the award-winning Latinos On Fast Track (LOFT) program as they transition from high school to college, to graduate school, and into their careers.”
