***New:* Remote German Language Classes**

“The Goethe-Institut New York is offering **full and partial tuition waivers** for German courses for young learners for our winter term. Beginning & advanced level classes are available.

How to apply: A statement of purpose with a minimum of 250 words is required. In this statement, students should address their motivation for learning German and their future study and/or career plans. If the applicant has any prior knowledge of German, they should explain their learning background in detail. If the student has any prior background in German (from previous classes or from family), they should explain this as well. Full or partial tuition waivers will be offered to applicants who demonstrate sufficient motivation to learn German.
