Other highlights this week:

---In the ACADEMICS category, some local colleges offer free **STEP (Science & Technology Entry Program)** over the summer for lower-income & under-represented students from all grades. These may cover a variety of interesting STEM topics. Applications for **Baruch College** in Manhattan (May 1st deadline), **Vaughn School of Aeronautics** (in Queens) and the **NYU Grossman School of Medicine** in Manhattan are already available online. And many private university pre-college summer course options have upcoming early-May deadlines; some offer financial aid.

---In the MUSEUMS/ART section, the ARAS Pioneer two-week hands-on program focuses on mythological & symbolic art from around the world. And many eminent museums – the **Whitney**, the **Museum of Modern Art**, and the **Noguchi Museum**, among others, offer summer programs for high school students.

---In the STEM section, there are fast-approaching application deadlines for the New York Historical Society's **Game Design** (for all 9th, 10th, and 11th graders) & **Web Design** (for all 9th, 10th, and 11th grade female-identifying students). **Girls Rise Up** combines Dance and Coding at locations in Manhattan & Brooklyn (April 30th deadline!). And Fordham University in Manhattan welcomes applications for its **GenCyber** cybersecurity one-week summer program.

And there are many excellent summer options in the WRITNG/THEATER category – some have fast-approaching deadlines.

“Our New York State funded program leverages Vaughn’s aeronautical heritage and world class robotics championship teams to expose students to STEM-related fields, aviation related fields, while providing tutoring, standardized test prep, and college prep. The Vaughn College STEP Academy prepares historically underrepresented and economically disadvantaged secondary school students for entry into postsecondary degree programs in STEM. NYU Tandon offers a wide variety of STEM-focused programs for high school students. The competitive free programs for local students provide unique opportunities for in-depth STEM studies and range from Applied Research Innovations in Science and Engineering, Computer Science for Cyber Security, Innovation, Entrepreneurship and the Science of Smart Cities. The fee-based programs are Programs in Integrated Design & Media, Machine Learning, Computer Engineering for Good, and Automation, Robotics, Coding.

1 - Design, Invent & Innovate (DII)

“This course will teach fundamental principles for innovative engineering and how to design. Students will use rapid prototyping tools and CAD modeling, conduct fieldwork, and gain hands on experience using Tandon’s Makerspace.”

“embedded systems” applications that draw from robotics, AI, remote sensing, cloud computing, etc. Participants will use various microcontroller platforms (Arduino, Raspberry Pi).”

3- Immersive Summer Interacting with Technology and Engineering (I-SITE)

“This interdisciplinary course will involve students in coursework, labs, activities, and workshops on ethics, public speaking, and presentation training. Students will use software tools involved with machine-learning (PyTorch). Coursework includes open-source software (Arduino, CircuitPython), circuit components, sensor integration, computer vision, direct/inverse kinematics, interactive programming, algorithms, data science, etc.”
