Please note that a large number of excellent opportunities have March 31st and April 1st and April 3rd deadlines – **NOW** is the time to focus and get your applications in!! There are many highlights for this week. For example:

---In the EVENTS section, there is an in-person **Youth Conference on Summer Opportunities** for students at Brooklyn College on **Monday, April 3rd** from 4:00 – 7:00pm. All students can receive information from providers of internships, community service options, jobs, and more. Additionally, the New York Public Library has a similar summer **Career Resources Fair** at 476 5th Avenue in Manhattan on **April 28th**, open to all students. And **Columbia University's Society of Women Engineers** invites all female-identifying students to their **Sunday, April 2nd** Engineering Event on campus, to learn about majors & careers in this field.

---In the GOVERNMENT/LEADERSHIP category, the **Chinatown Initiatives Summer Leadership Institute** offers leadership positions to current juniors & seniors, with a \$2,000 stipend. And the Summer Justice Institute is a free one-week hands-on legal program that introduces students to either the Brooklyn or Manhattan federal justice courthouses– open to current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders.

---In the MUSEUM/ART section, check out the new **Whitney Museum Youth Insights** summer program that introduces current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders to careers in the arts/museum management fields.
