Please note that a number of program opportunities have upcoming deadlines of March 1st or during the first week of March. With the midwinter break week off from school, **now** is a great time to select & apply to some of the summer & spring term opportunities listed below!

Here are some highlights for this week:

---In the ACADEMICS section, there is an item for the **February 25th virtual pre-college program fair** to learn about academic summer programs at many top U.S. colleges and universities. And check the separate link we've provided for a list of numerous summer pre-college courses open to high school students. While these can be expensive, many do offer some financial aid.

---In the **BUSINESS/JOB**s category, the **NYC Summer Youth Employment Program** application is now open to students from all grades. All students looking for summer opportunities should register, as it provides paid options and a chance to learn about real-world employment. Also, the **Manhattan District Attorney Office** welcomes all students to participate in their in-person **Resume & Interview Workshop** on February 24th – this is an excellent chance to speak with legal professionals & learn about their summer internship program.

And all female students can join the upcoming series of “**Rock the Street Wall Street**” **Business/Finance seminars** with successful women executives from the Invesco corporation. They will meet on five Tuesday afternoons at Stuyvesant from 2/28 – 3/28.

---In the STEM section, **Fordham University's GenCyber Security** summer program (at their Lincoln center campus) is a free one-week introduction to this growing field of computer science – it is open to all students.

HackNYU is scheduled for this weekend (2/18 – 2/19); students of all experience levels may participate and enjoy this fun, educational event.
