Some highlights for this week:

---In the ACADEMICS section, the virtual **NSLI free** language program, which runs from September to November, has an upcoming online Information Session scheduled for **June 6th**. The **National History Academy** offers four-week virtual & in-person sessions for 9th, 10th, and 11th graders with an interest in American history. And the New York Times welcomes applications for its summer **Online Explorations** journalism & writing classes.

--In the LEADERSHIP/GOVERNMENT category, there are a number of upcoming 'college-readiness' programs in which all students may participate. Current 11th and 12th graders may join the free virtual "Next Steps College Bridge" program. In the Bronx, the **RNH Summer Bridge** program helps current juniors with college essays, application advice, and more (& participants receive a \$200 stipend). And **the Queens Public Library** offers two upcoming virtual sessions (6/1 and 6/6 - geared to seniors) on transitioning to life & success in college. There is also a link to additional college admissions-oriented programs in this section.

Students interested in government, politics, and current affairs have a variety of free and low-cost summer programs to choose from – some deadlines are rapidly approaching!

--In the PARKS/NATURE category, **Alley Pond** (in Queens), the **Queens Botanical Garden**, **Prospect** and **Fort Greene** parks in Brooklyn, **Riverside Park** in Manhattan, and numerous other outdoors park programs are still accepting summer applications.
