Some interesting programs to consider are highlighted below:

- **ACADEMICS**: Some of the free **CUNY College Now** courses offered at campuses around the city are still accepting applications, check the link in this section to learn more.

BUSINESS: Free **resume/networking assistance sessions with Salesforce Corporation** professionals are scheduled for next week – all students may apply to participate. And the **Jane Street Company's** free programs for female, transgender, and gender-expansive students are also approaching.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: The **Visions** Inter-Generational program allows students 15 and older to help visually impaired/blind New Yorkers, either through home visits (with other teens), or at their centers.

Several other new service programs, ranging from assisting food programs to helping younger children, are also listed.

Deadline Approaching: Fordham University STEP Summer Program

“The Fordham Science and Technology Entry Program (STEP) is an academic enrichment program, established in 1986, designed to prepare underrepresented minority and economically disadvantaged junior high and high school students for college and careers in STEM fields (science, technology, engineering, and math) fields, health careers, and licensed professions, like accounting, law, psychology, social work among other licensed fields.”

Updated: STEP SUMMER Programs: “STEP (Science and Technology Entry Program) Academy is a New York State Education Department-funded pre-college program for middle and high school students interested in pursuing careers in the STEM professions. The goal is to increase the number of historically underrepresented and economically disadvantaged students prepared to enter college. The program

invites eligible students to participate in workshops and enrichment courses in math, science, SAT, and college preparatory workshops. All eligible students may apply, with different application deadlines for each campus.”

***Deadline Approaching:* Oceanography Course at SUNY Stony Brook**

“Students will examine the World Ocean and the chemical, geological, and physical processes that control its major features and the life that inhabits it, as well as explore human interactions with the marine environment. This intensive course is specifically designed for motivated high school students. The short-term course will run for 2 weeks and meet for 4 – 5.5 hours each weekday at the Stony Brook Southampton campus. Content will be delivered via lectures, in- class activities (including a live plankton lab!), and 2 boat trips during which students will explore nearby coastal habitats using oceanographic sampling equipment.”
